#### **Our vision-**

#### Our objective-

To help in the all-round development of deprived and disadvantaged sections of the society, particularly women and children belonging to the rural and urban communities through education, health, environment, social and economic development, irrespective of cast, creed and religion.

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All our activities are targeted towards promoting empowerment of the vulnerable and marginalized sections of the society, by making available resources and services and ensuring services provided are used effectively. We are working in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Uttrakhand and some parts of Haryana.

### **EDUCATION INITIATIVES:**

Since the Right to Education has come in to practice, govt. is in force to admit every child in the school. But there are lots of hurdles are on the way of implementation of this Act. The biggest question is infrastructure. As we have been working in rural and urban area both, need of infrastructure varies differently. For example, in rural area lot of space is available (not all) in the school, while in urban area, space is major problem. However, the present State Government has done a lot in the area of education and infrastructure building in Delhi. The result is remarkable and significant. Still there is lot to be done in education sector.

There are so many causes which stop a child to be part of education system. Poverty is one of them, which makes the child force to work by helping the parent to support financial burden of the family.

Since inception this is the belief of organization that education is best tool to bring change in the society, we have had education program for all age group of children irrespective of cast, creed, religion and gender.

During the period Nai Disha Program has been strong evidence to bring change in the life of hundreds of children who are deprived of education and system. We run Balwadi centres for small children and prepare them for mainstreaming of education while non-formal centre run for school dropouts and out of school children in Nithari village Noida and Okhla Industrial area New Delhi. In this year, we have voluntary based education program both in Delhi as well as in Nithari Noida. There was no grant for this program but with the support of friends and donation, we achieved our goal.

Since the incident of gruesome murder of children has come out in 2006 in Nithari village, the area has been priority in terms of providing support to school going children as well as dropouts. Small children with priority of nutrition have been the focus area of support. Child education has been focus area of the organization since inception. Believing with fact that education is an important tool to bring change in the society, NDS is focusing on girl child education in all over its programs. It has been come through our grassroots experiences that need to establish supporting school system for deprived children is still very much required.



#### TARGETED INTERVENTION PROGRAM:

#### **Female Sex Workers Program-**

#### **Behind Closed Doors**

Shakeela (Name changed) a 32 year old female sex worker migrated to Delhi with her boyfriend with pretext of getting good income in the city in 2013. She had a family in her village somewhere in West Bengal and she was married. She came in touch with one of the villagers-Akram, from same village who was living in Delhi. He lured her and she was runaway with him. Surviving in Delhi was difficult as well as problematic. After a month, Akram came home with another guy and insisted her to slip with him. Unwillingly in compulsion, she involved in this act and since then it became a regular practice. One day the Akram left her alone and disappeared. She was totally alone and unsecured. Meanwhile she came in touch with a person who was a regular customer of her and she started to live with him. During this period she got aborted thrice due to complications in her deliveries and later on she decided not to have children. Now she is living with her female colleague in Delhi and both are HRGs and beneficiaries of the organization the same. Fortunately the report found negative. We got the case registered in the ART centre to ensure that the life of Meera is prolonged for as long as possible. Now she is leading a normal life.

Targeted Intervention Program offers services to high risk groups such as FSW in the area of care and prevention by providing them with information, means and skills to manage HIV transmission, and providing care, support and treatment services within the community. The program is aimed at improving the reproductive and general health of these high risk groups. NDS has been implementing this program in association with Delhi State Aids Control Society Delhi Govt. for last many years and achieving goals to protect each and every person, especially female, from deadly disease of HIV/AIDS.

NDS TI Project completed the registration of 3024 HRGZ during the entire year and found 2253 active population in the area. The area covers entire south Delhi region including Sangam Vihar, Devli, Ambedkar Nagar, Chirag Delhi, Shaidulazab, Khanpur, Madangir and few more areas are there.

#### STI/Clinic Service management:



This is a regular service which has been provided throughout the year to HRGs of the region. Under this service we are providing counseling facility, doctor facility and medicine of special diseases like STD/ STI. Distribution of condoms is one of the best outreach activities which is bringing HRGs close to the centre and encouraging them to use this service and save their precious life.

Apart from that the Health Mela and community event is motivating and creating awareness among beneficiaries to protect them from this deadly disease through adopting various social ethics and medical contraceptives.

### **Behtar India Campaign**

#### Introduction and background:

Behtar India campaign is a nationwide initiative started by the Republic TV & the DHFL Pramerica life insurance Company Delhi in association with Charities Aid Foundation. The campaign aims at spreading awareness and progressive actions on health, hygiene and environment among children through school environment. The campaign carries its efforts in a participatory way where it joins hands with citizens, school children and corporate to ensure the tangible outcomes. Encompassing the health as a prominent component, Behtar India Campaign is combating with the severity of the deadly disease **Dengue**. The campaign has adopted a nationwide two tier approach involving awareness against the severity of the dengue and providing the safeguard through health policy cover especially for the most vulnerable and down trodden segment of the society with an aim of building better and healthy India.

The campaign, initiated its intervention in Dehradun, Uttarakhand and its surrounding area where the Navjyoti Development Society, with the support of CAF India, got an opportunity to be a part of this campaign.

As an inception of the campaign, NDS organized various orientation events in the schools and built rapport on the issue. We are thankful to the Education Department of the State who provided approval to conduct the activities in the schools and aware them about the issue. Earlier, NDS identified the government schools children along with picking the most marginalized children and connected them with the campaign.

#### **Activities Conducted:**

Various events were organized at different locations under Behtar India Campaign to spread the awareness against the severity of the dengue and providing the safeguard through health policy to the Children. The events were usually held in school premises. There were the school children and the school staff taking part in the events. Flagging of the proceedings of the events, the program team of NDS addressed the guests and the children and gave them an insight of the objective of the Behtar India campaign. Highlighting the importance of the prevention, attention was given on the easiest approaches of safeguarding someone from the dengue such as wearing full sleeves cloths regularly, regular cleaning the coolers, avoid water logging at home or school's surrounding, covering drinking water always etc.

Further, School authorities like Principals and head Masters used to share their thoughts with the children. They appealed to the children to disseminate the information on the prevention from dengue in their vicinity and siblings. They also inspired the children to work as a change maker and to play a proactive role in order to determine the best health and hygiene practices in the society. School Principals along with their staff thanked the NDTV and DHFL Pramerica life insurance for their noble initiative.

#### **ACHIVEMENTS**

The entire program was designed with the idea of providing an insurance cover to the children who come from economically weaker section of the society and could barely bear the burden of health expenses that arise from dengue. The target population for the programme was children studying in primary schools of Municipal Corporation located in various parts of South Delhi.

The total 2719 children were covered under the insurance policy and repellant kits were distributed among the children to be used in the classroom to prevent from mosquito bites. The program was organized with the support of South Delhi municipal corporation schools and MCD- Health Department.

#### **Our Plans**

After having an average financial year 2018-19, we (the Board of the organization) decided to explore more resources to sustain the objective of the organization. We plan to extend our helping hand further into the rural areas by providing hygiene and sanitation facilities in the villages. We have been successful at bringing a positive change in the lives of the community people through our current projects. Now we want to explore other sectors which would give us the scope for providing basic amenities while creating awareness within the community about the importance of healthy life style. Another area we wish to lodge our roots firmly into is **child abuse**, **disaster management and preparedness**.
